**Biography for: Matthew Pillsbury** 

#### MATTHEW PILLSBURY

Mathew Pillsbury, American, was born in Neuilly, France in 1973. He studied at Ecole Alsacienne, Paris graduating with an honour Baccalaureate in History and Economics in 1991; at Yale University graduating cum laude with distinction (BFA, 1995); and at the School of Visual Arts, New York, with Chairmans Honours (MFA, 2004).

Inspired by Hiroshi Sugimotos photographs of movie theatre screens, he makes long exposure black and white photographs of people watching television and working at their computers. The resulting images show flowing white screens and rooms dramatically lit by a single source. In addition, each long exposure captures the evanescent record of the human activity in the room. This technique deprives us of the individual likeness of his subjects, with a different kind of photographic portrait emerging from the presentation of the personal objects in the room, rendered in minute detail through the use of an 8 x 10 camera. Each image in these series is an open-ended reflection of our complex and evolving relationships to technology, culture and to each other.

#### **ARTIST STATEMENT:**

I make long exposure black and white photographs using a large format camera and available light. From it's inception photography's ability to capture time in a single image, usually a fraction of a second, has been used to reveal our world to us in ways that we cant perceive. Muybridge's studies of motion challenged us as viewers and showed us the proper mechanic of a horse's gallop. In using longer exposures, from a few minutes to over an hour, my photographs engage us to look at our world with a renewed sense of discovery and reveal visual truths in the everyday.

Starting with Screen Lives I became interested in the increasing role televisions, computers and cell phones were playing in our lives. The resulting images show glowing white screens and rooms dramatically lit by a single source. In addition, each long exposure captures the evanescent record of the human activity in the room. This common experience was transformed -- the spaces and experience though familiar are revealed to us in surprising ways. The photographs also allow viewers to address a conundrum that technology has interjected into our lives; at the same time that we have been given the possibility of instant global communication, we find ourselves increasingly isolated from each other physically.

More recently, I have ventured into the public sphere. New York City sets the stage for my examination of how we interact both with each other and with a metropolis that envelopes us in a never-ending pulse of life, light and art. I am interested in the ways in which people relate to and learn from their past -- how we are in dialogue with our surroundings. Inspired by a commission I did for The New York Times Magazine inside New York City's museums, I began photographing not only museums and the way people flow in and around historical artifacts, but the way in which they interact with old and new aspects of the city as well. In my own exploration of New York City over the years since I moved here, I've become attached to some of its iconic places and structures, such as the Brooklyn Bridge, but I've also taken keen interest in the new additions, such as Jane's Carousel and the High Line, that push the city to evolve while still reflecting its past. The extreme multiculturalism of New York City creates a heightened energy like few other cities and its incredibly varied architecture mirrors that, creating a striking backdrop as people weave through my photos, leaving traces of their own personal stories behind.
